Comment noted. There are no plans or proposals in the Y-12 SWEIS to build nuclear weapons or to increase the capability of manufacturing new nuclear weapons. DOE is committed to compliance with provisions of Executive Order 12898, *Federal Actions to Address Environmental Justice in Minority Populations and Low-Income Populations*. The environmental justice analysis was prepared in accordance with the CEQ's guidelines on environmental justice under NEPA. The proposed action and alternatives in the Y-12 SWEIS would not have a disproportionately high and adverse impact on the Scarboro Community.
